

Nagoya Institute of Technology Regulations on the Management of  
Drainage and Waste Materials

Established on April 1, 2004

(Purpose)

**Article 1** The purpose of these Regulations is to specify matters that are necessary to ensure appropriate management of drainage and water materials that are produced at Nagoya Institute of Technology (hereinafter, “the Institute”), excluding radioactive isotopes and materials that are contaminated by radioactive isotopes and other radioactive materials; the aforementioned management shall comply with the provisions of the Sewerage Act (Act No. 79 of 1958), the Water Contamination Prevention Act (Act No. 138 of 1970), the Waste Materials Disposal and Cleaning Act (Act No. 137 of 1970), other applicable laws and regulations, and these Regulations.

(Definitions)

**Article 2** The term “drainage” shall hereunder mean water that is discharged from the Institute into sewers and waters for public use.

2. The term “waste material(s)” shall hereunder mean the following:

- (1) Daily waste materials
- (2) Experimental waste materials
- (3) Other materials that are designated as such by the President of the Institute

3. The term “daily waste materials” shall hereunder include the following:

- (1) Recyclable waste materials
- (2) Inflammable waste materials
- (3) Non-inflammable waste materials
- (4) Bulky refuse
- (5) Other materials that are designated as such by the President

4. The scope of daily waste materials as per the paragraph above shall be specified separately from the present Regulations.

5. The “experimental waste materials” shall hereunder include the following:

- (1) Bottles, cans, and plastics
- (2) Broken glass
- (3) Waste materials containing mercury
- (4) Solid waste materials
- (5) Effluent

6. The term “person in charge of drainage” shall hereunder refer to the real estate supervisor, as defined under Article 11, Paragraph 1 of the Nagoya Institute of Technology Regulations on Real Estate Management (established on April 1, 2004; hereinafter, “Regulations on Real Estate Management”).

7. The term “second person in charge for drainage” shall hereunder refer to the assistant real estate supervisor, as defined under Article 11, Paragraph 1 of the Regulations on Real Estate Management.

(Drainage Standards)

**Article 3** Drainage Standards applicable at the Institute shall be established separately from these Regulations.

(General Supervision)

**Article 4** The President of the Institute shall supervise the overall management of drainage and waste materials.

(Management Duties)

**Article 5** Managers responsible for drainage and deputy managers responsible for drainage shall execute the duties listed below as persons responsible for the management of drainage and waste materials in sections assigned to them:

- (1) Devising measures so that drainage conforms to the standards as specified under Article 3;
- (2) Appropriately sorting and managing waste materials;
- (3) In the case of storing waste materials, taking appropriate measures so as to prevent them from catching fire, spreading, spilling, penetrating into the ground, or producing offensive odor; and
- (4) Other duties deemed necessary for appropriate management of drainage and waste materials.

(Reporting)

**Article 6** Managers responsible for drainage shall promptly comply when requested by the President to report on matters relating to the management of drainage and waste materials.

(Management Staff)

**Article 7** Managers responsible for drainage may appoint Supervisors to assist them in the execution of the Managers’ duties, as the need arises.

(Education and Training)

**Article 8** The President shall provide the faculty and students with necessary education and training relating to the management of drainage and waste materials.

(Compliance with Manuals)

**Article 9** The NIT faculty and students shall treat or dispose of waste materials in compliance with manuals that are designated by the President separately from these Regulations, as well as instructions by Managers responsible for drainage in corresponding sections.

(Miscellaneous Provisions)

**Article 10** Other matters that are necessary for appropriate management of drainage and waste materials and are not specified hereunder shall be specified separately from these Regulations.

Supplementary provision:

These Regulations shall come into force on April 1, 2004.

These Regulations shall come into force on July 1, 2009.
