Commencement and Spring Entrance Ceremony in 2019

Commencement was held on March 27th, 2019 at NTK City Hall. 21 Doctoral, 701 Master and 919 Bachelor, in total 1,641 of graduate were conferred degree diplomas. President Ukai said "Unpredictable and exciting world is waiting for you. The technology which draws the world is getting more complex, however, I believe you will be settled and can deal with the situation flexibly and survive."

Also on April 6th, 2019, the Entrance Ceremony at Nagoya City Assembly Hall was held and 977 students (Day courses), 24 students (Evening courses) for faculty of engineering, 742 students for Master course and 57 students for Doctoral course enrolled.




02 Topic

Center of Biomedical Physics and Information Technology Established on April 1st, 2019

With an aim to collaborate with advanced research hubs in both engineering and medical fields from home and abroad, establish a new academic field relating to human and foster human resources with a multifaceted and overlooked viewpoint of such field, NITech set the Center of Biomedical Physics and Information Technology. We set the goal to solve problems in the fields of medical, public health and product design and vertical contributions from international standardization to industrial promotion in Chukyo area.

The center acquires actual measured value in the section of “biological information sensing” and virtual high accurate data in a calculator in the section of “computational science” and coordinate them in the section of “data science” organically. By the collaboration of each section, the center aims the development and promotion in a new forecasting technology relating to human.

Work-Life Balance Seminar Held – toward supporting working environment –

On March 15th (Fri.), a work-life balance seminar-toward supporting working environment- was held at NITech Hall and a lounge of Building 2.

This seminar consisted of two parts and was targeted to technical and administrative staff both NITech and other universities in the morning, while targeted to female technical staff in the afternoon.

In the morning, we invited Mr. Kakiuchi from General Incorporated Association Work-Life Balance Tokai as a lecturer and hold a workshop entitled “Think about the communication for creating not bearing but supporting working environment.” 37 participants learned the importance of communication to understand each other in this workshop.

In the afternoon, 18 female technical staff who have also participated in the morning session were divided into four groups and had a discussion about four themes; environment, upskilling, myself (health, time and hobby) and family (childcare and nursing care). They deepened mutual understanding and exchange opinions actively.
